What is a “charrette”?



"Charrette" (Fr.) means a small cart.

Because architecture students once deposited their assignments in it as the cart was rolled through the studio, architects now use the word to refer to **an intense creative effort in a limited time period.**

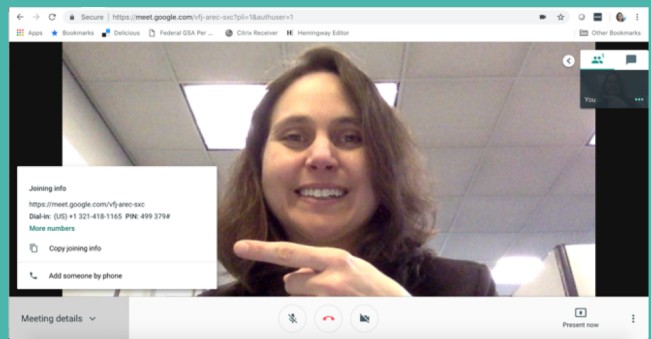
