

# INTERDISCIPLINARY LINGUISTICS MINOR REQUIREMENTS

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THE LINGUISTICS MINOR is an interdisciplinary minor that will provide you with a fundamental understanding of human language and the different ways in which language impacts our lives. You will develop this understanding through metalinguistic inquiry that will increase your ability to engage broadly with the forms and functions of communication via linguistics. This minor will encourage you to appreciate linguistic diversity, to think about language focused discrimination, and to recognize the vitality of language in the effort to develop diversity, equity, and inclusion.

## Program Requirements

- Students must earn **18 credit hours** from the following list of classes.
- A maximum of **9 credit hours** from a single discipline may be earned (ENG, SPAN, etc).
- Only **one** three-credit, foreign language course of any level may be counted towards the minor by the approval of the minor coordinator.
- Only **one** other three-credit course that is not listed below may be counted towards the minor upon consultation with and subsequent approval by the minor coordinator.
