Open Enrollment for Overtime Leave 1/25/13 - 2/24/13

- Full-time non-exempt employees are eligible to earn 1.5 hours overtime leave for every overtime hour worked, not to exceed more than 60 hours at any given time
- After 60 hours of leave are accrued, overtime will be paid in the appropriate pay advice
- Overtime leave must be approved by your supervisor
- Overtime leave appears in a separate leave account in MyMadison








Employee Spotlight

Spending the evening at a prison isn't something one typically chooses to do for their birthday, but it was the choice Pat Trissel happily made. Pat is a Housekeeping Supervisor who volunteers with her husband at the Fluvanna Correction Center for Women. The relationships that Pat has developed with the women to whom she ministers has become very significant and meaningful. According to Pat, these "ladies are like sisters". Her love and concern for them draw her back to the prison every time.







Pat genuinely feels that she receives more from this experience than she gives. Seeing God at work in these women's' lives ministers to her greatly. She has also learned some valuable lessons. She has nothing to give if she doesn't take the time to "fill herself" by reading the Bible and working on her spiritual life. Also, she has found out that we have more in common with those in prison than we might think. People are thrown into or grow up in difficult circumstances and make bad choices. A single bad decision can lead to a lifetime of heartache. Often, she thinks what she would have done in a similar situation. Many of us have used poor judgment, but fortunately it has not led us to be incarcerated. Pat strongly believes "there but for the grace of God go I".
