

JMU Facilities Introduces Peer-to-Peer Recognition Program: Caught in the A.C.T

"Caught in the A.C.T" is a new JMU Facilities peer-to-peer recognition program. The program will award individuals who demonstrate excellence in any of the following three core values of JMU Facilities: Accountability, Customer Service and Teamwork during the calendar month. This is a peer-to-peer recognition program, which means that employees nominate other employees/ peers for consideration. Nominations can be submitted any time but are limited for actions that have taken place within a specified calendar month. For example, nominations for actions taken during the month of May will be awarded in June, etc. Nominations can be made on the Facilities Management Caught in the A.C.T. website or by filling out a paper nomination card and dropping it in the FM Caught in the A.C.T. nomination mail slot at the main entrance of the University Services Building. The nomination cards are located on the desk next to the mail slot. Any JMU Fa-



cilities Employee is eligible to be nominated by any JMU employee. Nominations will be reviewed by the A.C.T. Committee and winners will be awarded each month. Each month's winners will receive a collector Caught in the A.C.T. pin and certificate as well as an Aramark dining certificate for a free meal.

Login Changes to MyMadison

For some time now, you have had the option of using either a Security Question Challenge or One Time Password Challenge in addition to your e-ID and password when logging in to MyMadison. You are also challenged with these options when you need to recover a forgotten or expired password.

As of January 4th 2017, this will change. The option to use a Security Question Challenge will no longer be available. The only means to complete the MyMadison login process will be to use a One Time Password sent to either a *non-JMU* email address or, preferably, to your mobile phone as a text message. In order to log in to MyMadison after January 4th 2017, you must set up your One Time Password information *prior* to that date.

If this is not completed by January 4, you will need to go to the Help Desk at the Student Success Center.
