The Center for Entrepreneurship provides a voice, an entry point, and a coordinating effort to promote entrepreneurial education and research, enriched by community outreach. At JMU no other college, department, or center addresses the growing nationwide need for entrepreneurship education.

Criteria 2: Support of University Priorities

The CFE supports many defining characteristics 1) The University will focus on student learning and development through collaboration across all divisions 2) The University will provide students with a wide array of extracurricular activities 3) The University will maintain our heritage of nurturing and cultivating enduring relationships with its constituencies 4) The University will be an environmentally literate community whose members think critically and act, individually and collectively, as model steward of the natural world.

The CFE is supported by the College of Business but additionally runs off of multiple Foundation funds. The following funds are currently available to the CFE:


