Here are the accomplishments of the Class of 2020!



- Class of 2020 graduates plan to attend James Madison University, Virginia Tech, University of Virginia, Radford University, Blue Ridge Community College, and Lord Fairfax Community College
- The graduating cohort has earned over \$400,000 in scholarships from outside sources and other universities. These scholarships include the Harry F. Byrd Leadership Award, SOAR scholarships, and several local community scholarships.
- The Class of 2020 completed 187 Advanced Placement (AP) , dual enrollment, and Governor's school classes, resulting in over 300 college credit hours.
- Six students graduated from the Shenandoah Valley Governor's School in Fishersville and Massanutten Regional Governor's School.
