A Strategy for Reading Textbooks

The following formula will help you maximize time spent reading textbooks.

- **P** = Preview the pages you plan to review.
- **Q** = Question what you intend to take from your study session.
- **R3** = Read, Recite, and Review.

P = Preview what you are going to read

- Gives you an idea of what you'll cover during your study session.
- Look for central ideas, main topics, and chapter headings.

Q = Question

- Take some time to think about what you'll learn during your reading.
- The following is a typical question: What were the primary factors that led to World War I?"

R = Read, Recite, and Review

- Read Read the assigned pages.
- Recite Stop periodically and summarize to yourself what you've learned.
- Begin the exercise here: "R" is short for read, recite, and review.
- Review once you're done with the reading, take time to review the main concepts.
- Begin the exercise here: "The main factors that led to World War I were ..."

You Are Finished

It is also beneficial to review difficult to understand sections once you're done reading. This will increase the efficiency of your study sessions.
