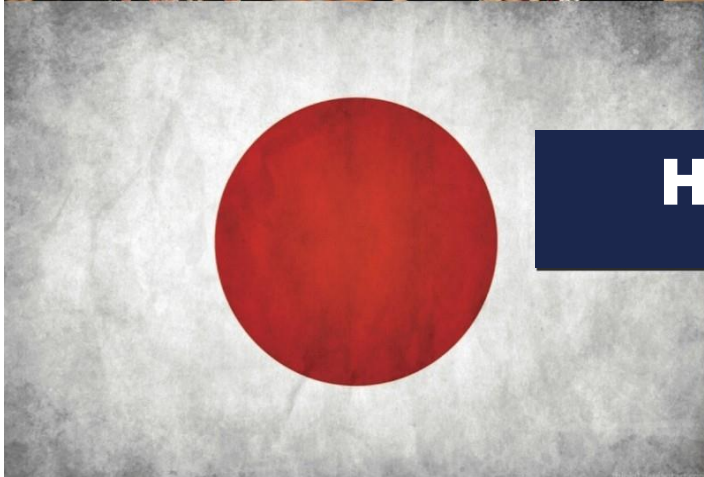


INU Student Seminar for Global Citizenship and Peace

JMU's Center for Global Engagement (CGE) and Honors Program will support four students' participation in the 2019 summer seminar (at least one of these students will be an honors student). Specifically, students' round-trip transportation from a Washington Airport, hotels and program fees (including admission to the peace museum and the memorial service) will be covered. The seminar's academic program will begin on August 4, 2019 and conclude on the evening of August 12, 2019.

The INU Student Seminar, held each year at Hiroshima University, is an interdisciplinary course, which aims to allow students from INU universities to learn about the concept of global citizenship through discussions, workshops, and cultural activities.

Any student who will return to JMU for studies in Fall 2019 may apply to the seminar.

PROGRAM COMPONENTS

- An intensive program with lectures and workshops with academic experts and guest speakers from around the world;
- Workshops that encourage stimulating discussion with an internationally diverse set of students;
- An interactive simulation of an international treaty negotiation process;
- An integrated cultural program that introduces a unique side of Hiroshima, which includes a visit to the Peace Memorial Museum and attendance at the annual Hiroshima Peace Memorial Ceremony on August 6.
