Why do I need health insurance in the United States?

- The U.S. government does not pay for medical treatment you are responsible for your own costs
- Medical treatment and care is VERY expensive here
- Illness and injury are unpredictable if you have an accident or get sick, you will need health insurance to help cover the cost of treatment

Cultural Insurance Services International (CISI)


- JMU requires that all international students on a F-1 or J-1 visa have health insurance coverage during their time as a student here.
- The ISSS office offers health insurance through Cultural Insurance Services International (CISI)
- All international students are automatically enrolled in the CISI policy, and the insurance fee is added to your student account bill each semester
 - You should receive an email to your JMU email address from enrollments@culturalinsurance.com with your insurance card. Check your JUNK or SPAM folder if you do not see it in your inbox.



Your CISI Insurance Card

Your CISI insurance card looks like this:



This is your proof of insurance. You will need to present this card when you see the doctor.

JMU Health Center Fees

JMU Health Center visits are <u>free</u>. Some services and tests have small fees.

For example:

Service	Cost
Birth control pills	\$7 – 9
Crutches, ankle braces, arm slings, etc.	\$10 – 40
Emergency contraception	\$20
Flu (Influenza) test	\$15
Flu (Influenza) vaccine	\$23
Late Arrival/No Show/Late Cancellation fee	\$25
STI, STD, HIV testing	\$5 – 20
Stitches for injuries	\$30 – 45
Tetanus Diphtheria (Td) Vaccine	\$22

"What if I get sick? Should I go to the Emergency Room at the hospital?"



- The Emergency Room is for very serious situations ONLY.
- Go to JMU's Health Center or urgent care if you have a cough, light fever, or mild pain.
- If you go to the ER when it is not an emergency, health insurance will not pay for it.

If you are NOT admitted to the hospital overnight, you are responsible for the first \$500 of your bill!

Life-Threatening Emergency

Dial 911

An ambulance will be sent to your location.







A visit at a doctor's office, urgent care, or hospital...

- 1. Make an appointment, if applicable
- 2. Present ID and proof of health insurance
- 3. Complete informational and medical history forms
- 4. See nurse, physician's assistant, or doctor
- 5. Go to the pharmacy, if needed
- 6. Pay for your medication and medical bills
 - Save receipts, all paperwork, etc.
- 7. Submit claim form to CISI, if applicable



Health Forms & Information Online

 The <u>ISSS Website</u> (ISSS → Resources → Health Insurance) has health insurance information and other forms and documents you should review.

Health Insurance Waiver Form

- If you have your own health insurance policy that is equivalent to JMU's CISI policy, you can complete a waiver form through the ISSS Terra Dotta portal with a copy of your policy and insurance card in English.
- Deadline: First 2 weeks of the semester

Overview of Health Insurance Coverage

James Madison University requires all students on an F or J visa to have health insurance cove offers a comprehensive health insurance plan through Cultural Insurance Services Internationa details of CISI coverage are listed in the <u>CISI Policy Brochure</u>.

The health insurance coverage will run for a full calendar year and begins on August 15*.

The cost for health insurance is \$633 each fall & spring semester*. This charge is added to the bill through the University Business Office (UBO). For questions on how to pay this bill, contact

Students will receive an email from CISI Enrollments with their insurance card and enrollment lean email from enrollments@culturalinsurance.com in your inbox; check your junk/spam folder if it.

The <u>CISI Participant Guide</u> explains how to access your online Participant Portal and the Mondroid and Apple. The portal and app allow you to always have your insurance card with you!

If you currently hold an insurance policy that provides equal levels of coverage and lasts for the academic year*, you may qualify to waive out of the JMU-sponsored health insurance plan thro wish to apply for a waiver, you must complete an insurance waiver application. See the health i page for more information.
