FULBRIGHT U.S. STUDENT PROGRAM

- Offers the opportunity to perform funded independent research, graduate study, or assistant teach in an English language classroom for 8-13 months in one of approximately 160 participating countries abroad
- Graduating seniors, graduate students, and alumni may apply; **enrolled students should apply through James Madison University; alumni are strongly encouraged to apply through James Madison University**

DAAD RISE PROFESSIONAL (RESEARCH INTERNSHIPS IN SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING)

- Provides practical, career-building summer internships in a German company or research center
- Recent graduates or graduate students in biology, chemistry, engineering, geology or physics may apply

KAUST RED SEA SUMMER PROGRAM

- Provides an opportunity for students to study marine science in the Red Sea through The King Abdullah University of Science and Technology (Saudi Arabia)
- Topics may include genomics, ecology, biological oceanography, microbiology, and environmental science
- BS/BSc and MS students with a strong background in core biological sciences welcome to apply

BOREN FELLOWSHIP

- Boren Fellowships offer up to \$25,000 for graduate students to add a critical-need language component to their graduate education; Fellows can study Africa, Asia, Central and Eastern Europe, Latin America, and the Middle East (no funds available for domestic study or study in Western Europe, Canada, Australia, or New Zealand)
- All recipients are required to perform at least one year of government service after graduation
- Graduate students at any stage of their careers may apply for **James Madison University nomination**

CRITICAL LANGUAGE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

- Offers funded intensive summer language institutes in 15 critical foreign languages (Azerbaijani, Bangla, Brazilian Portuguese, Hindi, Indonesian, Korean, Punjabi, Turkish, Urdu, Arabic, Persian, Chinese, Japanese, and Russian, and Swahili)
- All disciplines are welcome; applicants must demonstrate how the selected language relates to their field and future career goals
- Any student enrolled at the time of application, including graduating seniors, graduate students, and law school/medical school students may apply

TYLENOL SCHOLARSHIP

- Offers up to \$10,000 for students pursuing careers in health care (including medical school)
- Graduating seniors, graduate students, and medical school students may apply

NATIONAL SCIENCE FOUNDATION GRADUATE RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP (NSF GRFP)

- Offers over \$40,000/year for 3 years for students seeking a research-based master's or PhD in STEM or STEM education fields
- Graduating seniors and graduate students in their first year of study may apply

HERTZ FOUNDATION

- Covers the costs of education plus a generous stipend for graduate study in the applied physical and biological sciences, math, or engineering
- Those pursuing a PhD in an area of applied physical sciences who show exceptional intellect, creativity, problem-solving skills, technical training, potential for innovative research and ethical values may apply

RHODES SCHOLARSHIP

- Provides up to 32 Americans funding for 1-3 years of graduate study at Oxford University (any discipline)
- Graduating seniors, graduate students, and alumni (up to age 24) with extraordinary academic achievement, outstanding character, and the promise of service to the world can apply for **JMU nomination**

MARSHALL SCHOLARSHIP

- Provides 40 Americans funding for 2 years of graduate study at select UK universities in any discipline
- Graduating seniors, graduate students, and alumni with a 3.7+ GPA, demonstrated leadership skills, and ambassadorial potential may apply for **JMU nomination**

MITCHELL SCHOLARSHIP

- Provides up to 12 Americans funding for 1 year of graduate study at select colleges and universities on the island of Ireland (any discipline)
- Graduating seniors, graduate students, and alumni (up to age 30) with an exceptional record in academics, leadership, and service may apply for **JMU nomination**

GATES CAMBRIDGE SCHOLARSHIP

- Provides non-UK residents funding to pursue a full-time graduate degree at Cambridge University (most disciplines)
- Graduating seniors, graduate students, and alumni with outstanding intellectual ability, leadership capacity, and a clear dedication to service may apply; PhD applicants should already hold a master's degree

NIH OXFORD-CAMBRIDGE SCHOLARS PROGRAM

- Provides funding and stipends for students to pursue a PhD in biomedical research in an accelerated combination program at the NIH in the US and either Cambridge or Oxford in the UK
- Those intent on pursuing a PhD may apply; limited spaces available for those pursuing an MD/PhD

KNIGHT-HENNESSY SCHOLARSHIP

- Offers leadership development and funding for graduate study at Stanford University, including JD, MA, MBA, MD, MFA, MS, DMA, and PhD programs, as well as joint- and dual-degree programs
- No citizenship, age, or field of study requirements, but applicants should have received their bachelor's degree within the last 5 years (or will receive it before matriculating at Stanford)
- Knight-Hennessy Scholars should be demonstrated leaders invested in positive change
- Graduating seniors, graduate students, or recent alumni may apply; **JMU nomination/review preferred**

NATIONAL DEFENSE SCIENCES AND ENGINEERING GRADUATE FELLOWSHIP

- Provides 3-year fellowships (full tuition and fees, plus a stipend) for students pursuing a PhD in an area of interest to the Department of Defense, including Biosciences, Chemistry, Math, Physics, or Computer Science
- Those at or near the beginning of their doctoral studies in science or engineering may apply

SCHWARZMAN SCHOLARS

- Provides funding for a 1-year Master's degree at Schwarzman College at Tsinghua University in Beijing
- Students live with an international cohort and study Chinese Culture, History and Values; Leading Issues in the Global Economy; Leadership; Comparative Government; and Leading Issues in International Relations while also focusing on a concentration: Economics and Business, Public Policy, or International Relations
- Graduating seniors, graduate students, or alumni under the age of 29 with strong academic records, leadership potential, and an entrepreneurial spirit may apply; **JMU nomination/review preferred**

KNOWLES SCIENCE TEACHING FOUNDATION SCIENCE AND MATH TEACHING FELLOWS

- Provides nearly \$175,000 worth of assistance—including tuition assistance, monthly stipends, and grants for professional development and teaching materials—to those committed to teaching high school math or science
- Future teachers with or without certification who have a strong content knowledge of their field may apply

USAID DONALD M. PAYNE INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT FELLOWSHIP

- Offers up to \$90,000 over 2 years for a master's degree, internships on Capitol Hill and at USAID missions overseas, and professional development activities in exchange for service as a USAID Foreign Service Officer
- Graduating seniors, graduate students, or alumni with strong GPAs (3.2+) may apply; members of groups traditionally underrepresented in USAID and those with financial need encouraged to apply

THOMAS R. PICKERING GRADUATE FOREIGN AFFAIRS FELLOWSHIP

- Provides up to \$40,000 for graduate study for those preparing to enter the U.S. Foreign Service in exchange for at least 5 years of service as a Foreign Service Officer
- Those with a 3.2+ GPA may apply; women, minorities, and those with financial need are encouraged to apply

CHARLES B. RANGEL INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM

- Provides 20 Fellows with 2 years of graduate school support, internship and professional development opportunities, and assistance entering the Foreign Service in exchange for at least 5 years as a Foreign Service Officer
- Those pursuing graduate degrees and Foreign Service positions with a 3.2+ GPA may apply; members of underrepresented minority groups and those with financial need encouraged to apply

FORD FOUNDATION PREDOCTORAL FELLOWSHIP

- Offers tuition and stipends for up to 3 years for minority students enrolling in research-based PhD programs leading to careers in university teaching and research
- Those showing superior scholarship and great promise as scholars and teachers in higher education may apply

JAMES MADISON GRADUATE FELLOWSHIP

- Provides up to \$12,000 toward tuition and expenses for 1-2 years of graduate study to support future secondary school teachers working toward a MA (or MAT) in American History or Political Science
- Those with an interest in the Constitution who intend to teach after graduate school may apply

SAMVID SCHOLARSHIP

- Provides up to \$50,000 per year for two years of graduate study, as well as two years of leadership development programming
- MD, MBA, JD, MPP/MPA, MPH, EdD, and MS/MA degrees in the social sciences or STEM are eligible; programs must last two (or more) years; applicants must have a 3.5+ undergraduate GPA and should not be enrolled in a graduate program at the time of application

PAT TILLMAN SCHOLARSHIP

- Provides ~\$10,000 (renewable) scholarships to be used toward undergraduate, graduate, and professional degrees
- Applicants must be veterans, active-duty military service members (all branches, including the National Guard) OR the current spouse or a veteran or active-duty service member, including surviving spouses; strong academic and leadership records required
