Travel Grants. Are you traveling to present at a conference? Graduate students who have a body of work that has been accepted for presentation at a conference are eligible to apply for travel grants. Travel grants help cover the cost of professional travel. This year, the application process has been revised. Graduate Polices. You are responsible to read and follow the graduate policies set forth in the <u>Graduate Catalog</u>. Important information regarding degree progress, including rules for successful progression and continuous enrollment are also on the <u>Graduate School website</u>

Approval of a Thesis or Dissertation Committee. Students who are completing these sorts of project must submit a signed approval form to The Graduate School by the second week of the semester in which the student first registers for thesis or dissertation credits. <u>Approval form</u>

Monitor your Dukes E-Mail account! Official information is sent to each student's official <u>Dukes e-mail account</u>. Check your @dukes.jmu.edu e-mail account on a regular basis.

Monitor <u>MyMadison</u>! The *Student Center* in <u>MyMadison</u> is where you will find advising information, register for classes, and where you can view "*To Do Items*" that will keep you on track towards graduation. Use the Student Center to update your mailing address and cell phone number. It is *your responsibility* to maintain accurate contact information. Check your account regularly.
