**Graduate Polices.** You are responsible to read and follow the graduate policies set forth in the <u>Graduate Catalog</u>. Important information regarding degree progress, including rules for successful progression and continuous enrollment are also on the <u>Graduate School website</u>

**Approval of a Thesis or Dissertation Committee.** Students who are completing these sorts of project must submit a signed approval form to The Graduate School by the second week of the semester in which the student first registers for thesis or dissertation credits. <u>Approval form</u>

**Monitor your Dukes E-Mail account!** Official information is sent to each student's official <u>Dukes e-mail account.</u> Check your @dukes.jmu.edu e-mail account on a regular basis.

**Monitor MyMadison!** The *Student Center* in MyMadison is where you will find advising information, register for classes, and where you can view "*To Do Items*" that will keep you on track towards graduation. Use the Student Center to update your mailing address and cell phone number. It is *your responsibility* to maintain accurate contact information. Check your account regularly.
