This document is provided as an advising resource only. Official curriculum requirements are listed in the JMU Undergraduate Catalog. In the case of discrepancies, the University Catalog is the official curriculum students must follow. This document was reviewed by Jason Gochenour on December 16, 2024.

To declare the major, the student must submit a request in MyMadison and attend an in-person change of major meeting. Incoming first-year and transfer students who have not previously matriculated to JMU will declare the major as part of orientation, and do not need to complete these additional steps.

All required SRM classes are offered Fall and Spring – there is limited summer availability for some classes, but this should not be depended upon to speed up graduation date.

The Major Elective requirement may be fulfilled with any nine credit hours of: SRM courses at the 300- or 400-level that are not required for the major; any courses from the Sport Communication or Coaching Education minors; or any other courses relevant to the major with permission from a Hart School advisor.

Students are limited to a maximum of one additional course while enrolled in the SRM 482 internship. During a fall or spring semester only, students may request permission from the Internship Coordinator to take two courses in addition to the internship.

All courses, including practicums and internships, carry tuition costs. Summer tuition is billed separately.

A final 2.0 GPA is required for all declared programs, including the required minor.

All students must earn a minimum of 120 credits for graduation.

Some students may apply for and be accepted into the Entrepreneurship minor. This minor replaces the General Business requirements for SRM students. All SRM students must complete either the General Business or the Entrepreneurship minor.

It is the student's responsibility to: be aware of and abide by departmental policies and deadlines. be aware of all prerequisites as outlined in the catalog, be aware of and fulfill all graduation requirements as outlined in the catalog, declare the appropriate major (SRM – BS) and minor (General Business or Entrepreneurship) via MyMadison.
