

Momento360

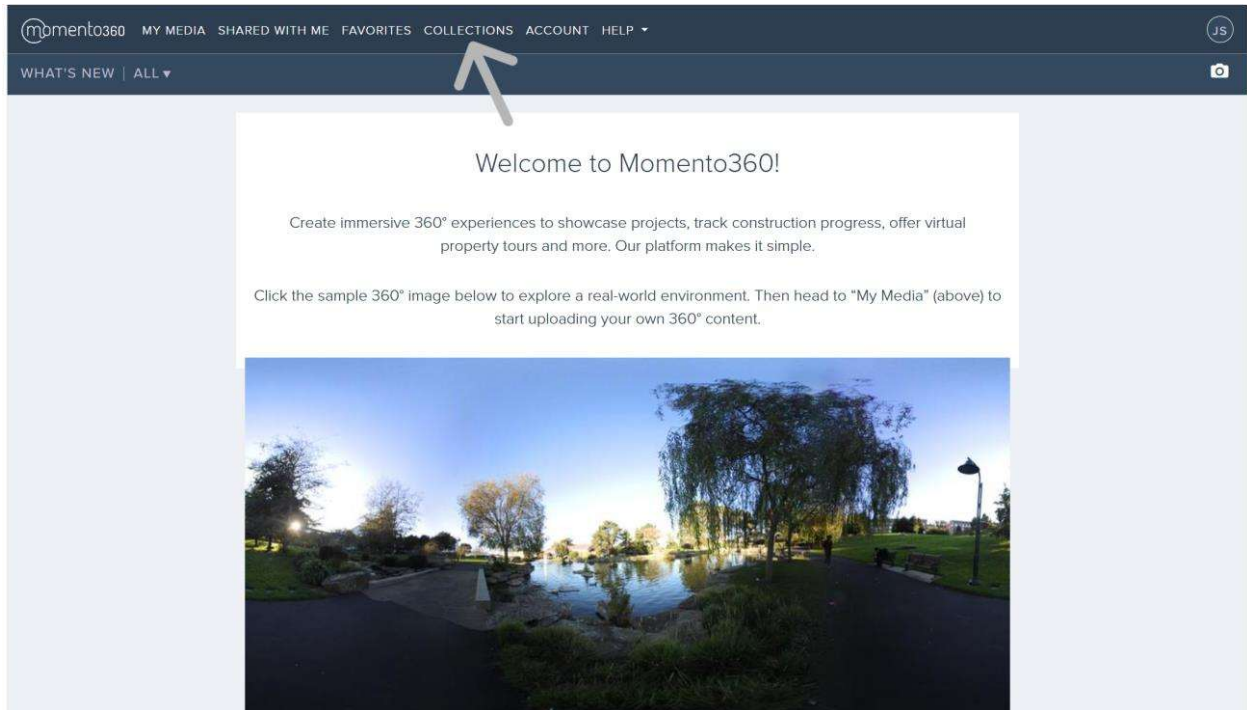
Momento360 software can be used to create virtual history tours of rooms, buildings, streets, or anything else. The History Studio subscribes to the Personal Plus Plan which includes unlimited sharing, audio, video, and image embeds, and up to 100 collections (tours).

You will need:

- GoPro Max 360 camera to take 360 images (unless they are sourced elsewhere)
- Studio computer (to sign in to Momento360)

Getting Started:

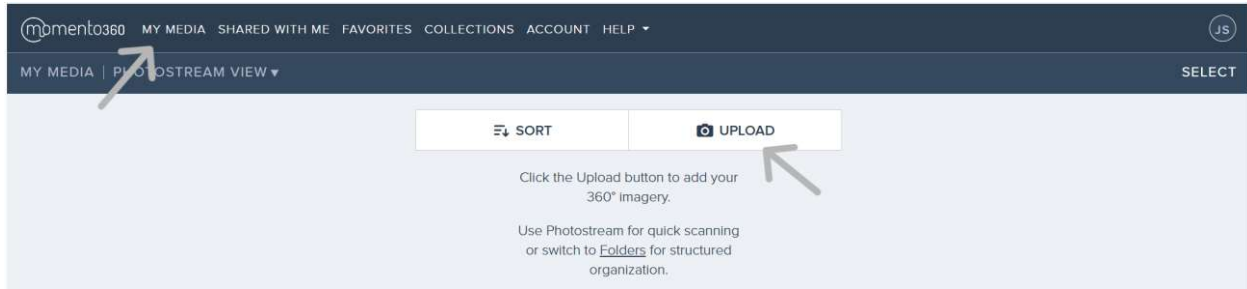
Ask one of the graduate assistants to sign in to Momento360 on a Studio computer. Once you are signed in, create a Collection.



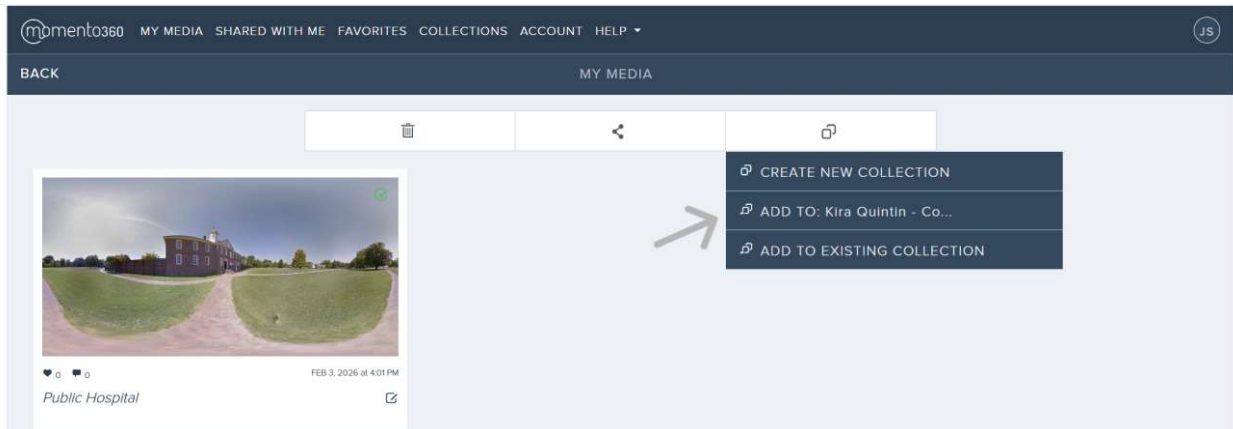
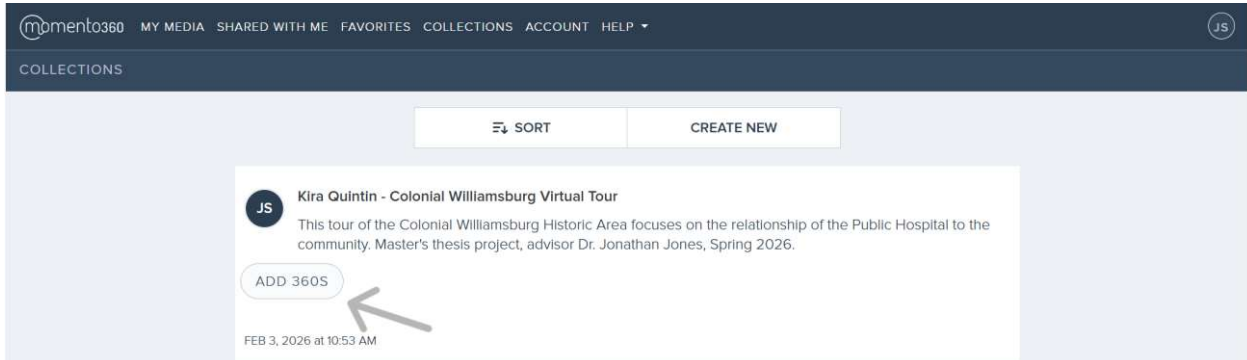
Title your collection “FirstName Last Name – Title of Tour” - example: “Kira Quintin – Colonial Williamsburg Virtual Tour”

Add a description including a sentence about your project, the semester, class name (if applicable), and professor (if applicable). Example: “This tour of the Colonial Williamsburg Historic Area focuses on the relationship of the Public Hospital to the community. Master's thesis project, advisor Dr. Jonathan Jones, Spring 2026.”

Go to the “My Media” tab and upload your 360 images.

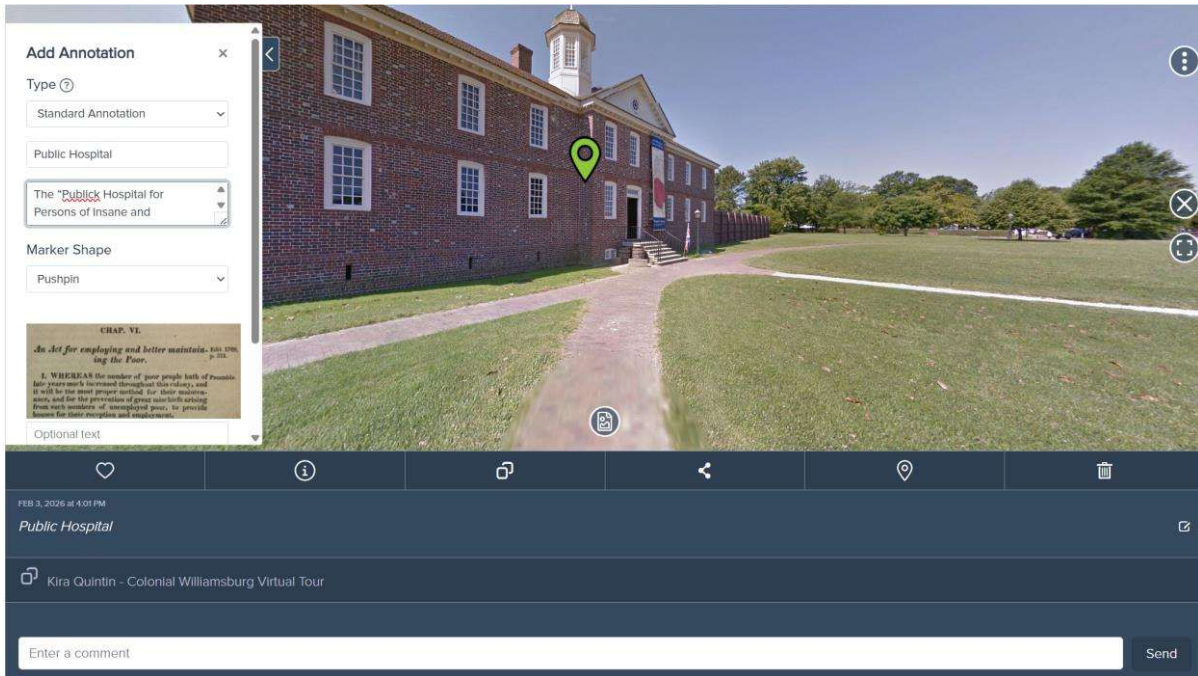


Once your images are uploaded, add them to your collection.



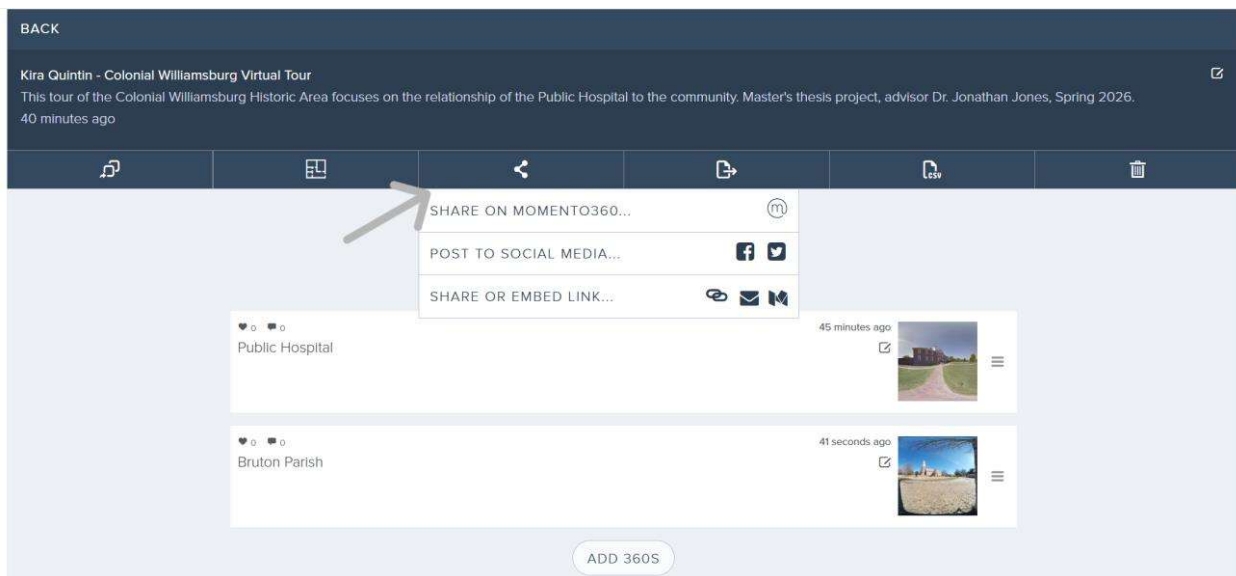
Go into each 360 image to add annotations to your tour. Right click to place a marker and type or upload your material. You can add:

- Text
- Images
- Audio
- Video
- HTML



Repeat for all of your images to create your virtual tour.

When you are ready to share, you can do so from your Collection home page.





Don't forget:

Be sure to delete any images you do not need to leave the storage space for other projects.
