Honors Thesis <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◦ Most common pathway for students ◦ Independent scholarship with faculty guidance resulting in substantial written thesis or creative product ◦ Final three semesters ◦ Completed through your major or minor; Honors interdisciplinary projects are possible ◦ Enroll through the department in which the project is being completed (xx. PSYC 499A; ECON 499A; HIST 499A) for 6 total credits ◦ Normal credit sequence: 1-3-2. Variations: 3-2-1, 2-2-2, or 1-2-3. ◦ Degree conferral of "with distinction" ◦ Final documents submitted to Honors 	OR	Senior Portfolio Project <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◦ Collection and synthesis of your academic and co-curricular activities and accomplishments ◦ Final two semesters ◦ Completed through the Honors College ◦ Enroll in HON 401 and 402 for 3 total credits ◦ To satisfy requirement, identify a project-based course in your major/minor, or take an additional 3-credit Honors course ◦ Final documents submitted to Honors
