Smart Beginnings Shenandoah Valley was one of 17 early childhood systems-building initiatives across the state anchored by the Virginia Early Childhood Foundation (VECF), the non-partisan steward and capacity-builder for advancing school readiness in the Commonwealth. As grant's sole employee: Cultivated a vast volunteer network to build capacity of the early childhood system in the Shenandoah Valley; furthered cross-sector collaboration; cultivated best practices and data-driven decision making; maximized communication between state, regional and local stakeholders. Primary duties included fiscal management; fund development and grant writing; Advisory Board development and leadership support; project management; assessment; and public relations and outreach efforts such as event planning, content creation, and vibrant public speaking and media appearances.

Worked on NSF-funded collaborative project to create two interrelated datasets on identity and representation in U.S. state legislatures [National Science Foundation (SES-0618368). Coded variety of primary documents to identify the gender, racial, and ethnic identity of all individual state legislators in a sample of state-years, as well as the primary sponsors, committee referrals, final disposition, and issue content of all bills introduced during the regular session of each state-year lower chamber. This information enabled the principal investigators to measure intersecting gender and racial/ethnic identities of state legislators as they relate to the number of women's interest bills – variously defined – introduced by each legislator as primary sponsor. The datasets enabled researchers to critically evaluate "identity politics" assumptions that often surround the politics of descriptive representation and group interests.
