JMU's Six-Year Graduation Rate has consistently exceeded 80% over the past decade. In 2016. JMU boasted the third highest six-year graduation rate in Virginia among other four-year public institutions.

Student-Faculty Ratio

The University has maintained a 16:1 student-to-faculty ratio since 2009-10, even with enrollment increasing over 12% during that same period.

Athlete Graduation Rate

Graduation rates for JMU athletes have met or exceeded the overall graduation rate, remaining steady at 83% in 2015-16.


Instructional & Academic Support










Student Satisfaction


