This work has been done through the commitment and passion of a small number of JMU volunteers that make up the Veteran Scholars Task Force led by Jennifer Taylor and Nick Swayne. It is time for the University to create a stronger and more well-resourced set of services and supports for our Veteran, Dependent, and Active Military students. We are hoping to build a stronger support system and begin taking a more proactive step in recruiting this community to JMU.

In 2019, College Factual named James Madison University the best college in the United States for providing quality education to veterans. This is not only a great honor, it is an example of the great work of two staff members in the Office of the Registrar and a team of volunteers dedicated to this population. This honor, along with some amazing strides including a Veterans Lounge, have all occurred without any dedicated staff working on behalf of this community.

In the Fall of 2021 the Veteran Scholar Task Force approached Student Affairs and requested that we take the lead in serving this community of students. We are in the transitioning this community currently and that process will be completed in April of 2022. We are committed to growing the support for this community institutionally but we can do more, faster, with your support. JMU has the opportunity to be of service to those who have served and become the model of a veteran friendly campus.
