#### About the JMU Brass Band

Formed in 2000 by Professor Kevin Stees, the JMU Brass Band has established itself as one of the most successful collegiate brass bands in the world. The ensemble has earned numerous honors at the North American Brass Band Association Championships, including the 2004 and 2005 1st Section titles, multiple Championship Section runner-up finishes, and the 2024 Championship Section title.

In addition to regular performances on campus and throughout Virginia, the band has been featured at the American Trombone Workshop, Virginia Music Educators Conference, Great American Brass Band Festival, U.S. Army Tuba Euphonium Workshop, and the Southeast Regional Tuba Euphonium Conference. Internationally, they have toured England, performed at the International Tuba Euphonium Conference in Austria, appeared at the Royal Northern College of Music Brass Band Festival in Manchester, and represented the United States in the 2022 World Music Contest in the Netherlands.

The JMU Brass Band is committed to new music, having presented the North American premieres of more than a dozen major works, and is currently ranked among the top 100 brass bands worldwide.
