Biographies

Diane Phoenix-Neal performs nationally and internationally as a collaborative musician and soloist, with appearances at Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center, the Kennedy Center, Banff Centre, Bowdoin International Music Festival, and Spoleto. In France, she served as principal solo violist of the Orchestre de Picardie and violist of Quatuor Joachim. Her sound has been described as "rich and sumptuous" and "priceless as it was memorable" (Cultural Voice of North Carolina). She is a longstanding principal performer with the Shenandoah Valley Bach Festival and a collaborative artist and faculty member at the Eastern Music Festival for more than twenty-five years. An active member of the American Viola Society, in 2026 she will present a recital at the 50th International Viola Congress in Paris and host the American Viola Festival at JMU from June 3-6 2026. Originally from North Carolina, she studied at the Juilliard School with William Lincer and the Juilliard Ouartet, UNC School of the Arts, and earned a D.M.A. from UNC Greensboro. Dr. Phoenix-Neal is Associate Professor of Viola at James Madison University.

Paulo Steinberg performs as a soloist and collaborative pianist across the United States, Canada, South America, and Europe. A frequent adjudicator, master class clinician, and guest lecturer, he is deeply engaged in artistic and educational projects around the world. He is particularly interested in Brazilian music and in exploring underrepresented repertoire. During his recent sabbatical year, he focused on Latvian music, spending extended time in Latvia researching and performing works by Latvian composers. He also uses social media—particularly Instagram—as a tool for teaching and sharing educational content to reach and inspire a broader audience beyond the classroom. He holds degrees in Piano Performance from Conservatório "Carlos Gomes" and Universidade de São Paulo in Brazil, as well as graduate degrees from Arizona State University (M.M.) and Indiana University (D.M.). His recordings include The Recital Clarinetist, Duos, Time, Place, Spirit, and Alma Brasileira. Dr. Steinberg is Professor of Piano at James Madison University.
