### Major Advising – Your Academic Support System


### Student responsibilities:

### Experiential Learning & Professional Development




- Experiential Learning: A process through which students develop knowledge & skills from direct experiences outside the traditional academic setting.

### **Experiential Learning for Academic Credit**

### **Hospitality Management**

- 1000 hours of experience prior to graduation
  - 600 hours by junior year or 2nd/3rd semester in program
  - 400-hour senior-year summer internship
- Aramark externship (counts toward 600 total)





### **Experiential Learning for Academic Credit**

### **Sport & Recreation Management**

- 490 hours of experience prior to graduation
  - 90-hour practicum (after SRM 241)
  - 400-hour senior-year internship







- Connect students with industry employers
  - Networking opportunities & other career-readiness programming
  - Mock Interviews
  - Industry panels
- Career & internship fairs (HM & SRM employers)
- Resources for internships and job opportunities
- Provide assistance with resume and interview prep


