23 years, Associate Dean Molly Brown has been a driving force behind initiatives that have shaped the student experience at JMU.

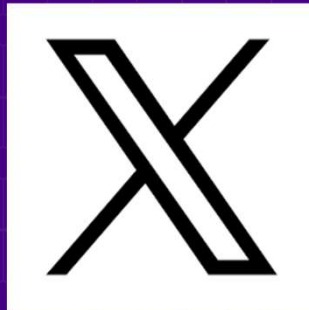
