SUBSEQUENT ENROLLMENT: ADMITTED TO JMU, NOT ENROLLED



Background

This report summarizes the subsequent enrollment trends for JMU applicants who were admitted but did not enroll. The relevant list of applicants was submitted to the National Student Clearinghouse (NSC) as a subsequent enrollment query. We then analyzed the data received back from the NSC to determine what institutions (if any) these applicants attended *during the term in which they had originally applied for JMU*.

Applicants were included in this report if they:

- 1. Applied to JMU as first-time, first-year undergraduates for Fall 2023.
- 2. Had no enrollment record for the relevant admit term (regardless of enrollment deposit)

Population: A total of 23,574 unique students were included in the National Student Clearinghouse data submission.




