#### TIMELY NOTIFICATION BULLETIN

Possible Threat to the Community

"Your Right to Know"

January 24, 2011

**OFFENSE: Indecent Exposure**

**LOCATION: C12 Parking Lot / Near Reservoir Street Soccer Fields**

**TIME: Monday, January 24, 2011 at approximately 5 PM**

**SUSPECT: White male, described as approximately 25 - 30 years of age, heavy build with black hair , black facial hair, dark colored eyes, and wearing a black shirt. Suspect was last seen operating a very clean silver colored Toyota Tundra pickup truck.**

In compliance with the "Timely Notice" provisions of the federal *Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act of 1998* the University Police are giving notice of a report of indecent exposure on the campus of James Madison University.

A female witness reported that while she was walking through the C12 parking lot at approximately 5 PM, a white male exposed himself to her near the Reservoir Street Soccer Fields. Suspect was described as approximately 25-30 years of age, heavy build with black hair, black facial hair, dark colored eyes, and wearing a black shirt.

Suspect was last seen leaving the area in a very clean silver colored Toyota Tundra pickup truck.

The case is still being actively investigated by law enforcement. Members of the University community are urged to be vigilant and report any unusual circumstances and/or suspicious activities/persons to law enforcement immediately.
