Washington Semester


- ✓ Students take 2 courses plus a 6-credit internship

Political Science major

- B.A. degree (39 credits)
- Study of domestic and world politics as well as political philosophy
- For students interested in
 - ✓politics & elections
 - ✓international relations & diplomacy
 - ✓ national security & public policy
 - ✓ the politics of other countries
 - ✓ political philosophy

Political Science Requirements

- 39 credit hour major
- Core:
 - ✓ Introduction to Western Political Theory
 - ✓ U.S. Government
 - ✓ Comparative Politics and International Relations
 - ✓ Research Methods in Political Science (MATH 220 prereq)
- Depth requirements across the four political science subfields
 - ✓ U.S. Politics, Comparative Politics, International Relations, Political Theory
- Two additional electives
- Senior capstone seminar
- Internship recommended, but not required

International Affairs

- B.A. Degree with enhanced foreign language skills (50 credits)
- Interdisciplinary: political science, history, economics, culture, and foreign language
- For students interested in international politics & foreign policy, international economic relations, and the characteristics of government & society in other countries
- 4 concentrations are available:
 - √ Foreign Policy & Global Governance
 - √ Global Human Development
 - ✓ International Conflict & Security
 - √ Comparative Study (of a geographic region)

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International Affairs

- 50 credit hours required to complete major
- Core (32 credit hours)
 - ✓ POSC 230 (International Relations)
 - ✓ POSC 240 (Comparative Politics)
 - ✓ ECON 200 (Macroeconomics)
 - ✓ ECON 201 (Microeconomics)
 - ✓ ECON 270 (International Economics)
 - ✓ HIST 330 or POSC 370 (diplomacy & foreign policy)
 - ✓ INTA 295 Research Methods (MATH 220 prereq) Foreign language (two 300-level courses)
 - ✓ INTA 489 Senior Capstone Seminar

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International Affairs

Concentrations (18 credit hours)

- International Relations Concentrations (6 classes)
 - Three thematic concentrations: Foreign Policy & Global Governance, Global Human Development, International Conflict & Security
 - ✓ One course on political dynamics
 - ✓ One course on historical patterns
 - ✓ One course on regional/cross-regional sociopolitical dynamics
 - ✓ Three additional courses relevant to the concentration
- Comparative Study (6 classes)
 - Five area concentrations: Africa, Asia, Europe, Latin America, & Middle East
 - ✓ Four courses on that geographic area
 - ✓ Two international relations courses

- B.S. Degree (39 credit hours)
- Applied interdisciplinary program with courses in political science, public administration and economics
- For students interested in public affairs and public policy including non-profit organizations
- 2 concentrations are available:
 - ✓ Public Management & Administration
 - **✓ Public Policy**

Five-year Masters in Public Administration (M.P.A.)

- Want to graduate in five years with an M.P.A. degree?
 - ✓ Apply to five-year program in sophomore year & begin taking preparatory courses
 - ✓ Apply to graduate program as a junior
 - ✓ Begin taking graduate courses as a senior
 - ✓ Complete the graduate program 12 months after your senior year



Masters in Political Science in European Union Policy Studies

- ✓ Based in Florence, Italy
- ✓10-month program
- ✓ Graduate with a B.A. and an M.A. in 5 years

Minor Programs

- Political Communication
 - √25 to 26 credit hours
 - ✓ Interdisciplinary with courses in political science, communications, and media arts & design
 - ✓ For students interested in campaigns & elections and public relations in the public sector
- Political Science
 - √ 19 credit hours
