## Indecent Exposure – JMU PD #2011-015544 TIMELY NOTIFICATION BULLETIN

Possible Threat to the Community "Your Right to Know" September 5th, 2011

## **OFFENSE: Indecent Exposure**

LOCATION: East Campus Library, Second Floor

TIME: Monday, Sept 5<sup>th</sup>, 2011, between 9:30 & 10:10 PM

SUSPECT(S) An unknown black male, 6' to 6'2' tall, light skinned with short, "wave" style, black hair, wearing a black rain jacket and black windbreaker pants

In compliance with the "Timely Notice" provisions of the federal *Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act of 1998* the James Madison University Police Department is giving notice of an incident involving an alleged indecent exposure that occurred on the second floor of the East Campus Library.

On Monday, Sept. 5<sup>th</sup>, 2011 between 9:30 and 10:10 PM, an unknown light-skinned black male is reported to have exposed himself to the witness on the second floor of the East Campus Library. The witness stated the subject sat near her at approximately 9:30 PM, at approximately 10:10 PM, the witness observed the subject exposing himself. The subject was last seen on the second floor of the East Campus Library. The witness left the area. The subject was further described as wearing a black rain jacket, black windbreaker pants, with short, "wave" style, black hair.

JMU and the City of Harrisonburg want to encourage everyone in the Community to exercise good crime prevention strategies all the time and to make these good daily habits. Close and lock all exterior doors and windows at night and anytime the area is left unattended whether it be for 5 minutes or 5 days to go to class, go to the store, visit a friend or leave town for the holiday. Be particularly cautious about leaving ground level doors and windows unsecured and even individual room and office doors in complexes where multiple occupants have access to common areas inside the perimeter of the residential, administrative and academic facilities. This warning also extends to vehicles. Car windows should be up, car doors should be locked and valuable contents should be secured out of sight.
