Possible Threat to the Community "Your Right to Know" May 5th, 2012

OFFENSE: Robbery

LOCATION: 1300 Block of Devon Ln.

TIME: Saturday, May 5th, 2012, at approximately 1 AM

SUSPECT(S): 2 males

1. First Offender a black male approximately 6', wearing a dark t-shirt, shorts and dark hat.

2. Second Offender a white male with thin build, approximately 5'5" wearing a dark t-shirt and dark hat.

In compliance with the "Timely Notice" provisions of the federal *Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act of 1998* the James Madison University Police Department is giving notice of an alleged robbery reported by the Harrisonburg Police Department on Saturday, May 5th, 2012.

The Harrisonburg Police Department is looking for two suspects, whom are responsible for a robbery that occurred early Saturday morning.

Around 1 a.m. a male victim was approached in the 1300 block of Devon Lane by two males. After being assaulted by both males the victim realized the offenders also took his wallet and cell phone.

One offender is described as a black male with a thin build and approximately 6 feet tall. He was last seen wearing a dark t-shirt, shorts, and a dark-colored hat.

A second suspect is described as a white male with a thin build and approximately 5 feet 5 inches tall. He was also last seen wearing a dark t-shirt and dark-colored hat.

Both offenders were last seen running eastbound down Hunters Ridge Road.

The victim's injuries were minor and he was not transported to the hospital.
