TIMELY NOTIFICATION BULLETIN

Possible Threat to the Community
"Your Right to Know"
October 25, 2010

OFFENSE: Simple Assault

LOCATION: Parking Lot in the 500 Block of Copper Beach Circle, in the City of Harrisonburg

TIME: Early morning hours of Sunday, October 24, 2010 between 12:30 AM and 01:30 AM.

SUSPECT: Group of unknown black males

In compliance with the "Timely Notice" provisions of the federal *Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act of 1998* the University Police are giving notice of a incident reported to the Harrisonburg Police Department involving an alleged incident of Assault that occurred off-campus.

The Harrisonburg Police Department advise they are investigating an incident that reportedly occurred Sunday morning, October 24, 2010 in the 500 Block of Copper Beach Circle in Harrisonburg, VA. A male victim reported that a group of black males assaulted him in a parking lot after he had been involved in a verbal altercation with the group. The victim was taken to RMH with non-life threatening injuries.

The case is still being actively investigated by law enforcement. Members of the University community are urged to be vigilant and report any unusual circumstances and/or suspicious activities/persons.
