Narcan Greek Life Bill

- **Pro Marcus:** super long effort to work with lots of different offices around campus to stop an opioid overdose before it starts. This affects a lot of people (20%) of the student body. This is a preemptive measure, just because it hasn't happened yet, doesn't mean that it won't. Lots of different perspectives have been explored, there is also a student group that
- **Pro Kenzie:** it's a growing issue clearly and it's important to students and necessary
- POI Parker: were there any disagreements offered by the greek life groups you talked to
 - There were no disagreements among Greek groups, everyone is excited to work alongside marcus
- Pro Mason: this will be able to save lives, it hasn't happened yet, but preventative is important
- **Pro Marcus**: the reason that this is focused on Greek Life is because they have Risk Management people and there is infrastructure in place already. This isn't met to single out Greek Life, there is just existing roles in place that make this easier
- **Pro Parker**: 1/10th of our campus is Greek life, this affects a lot of people. This is a preventative measure that will help people

Narcan Residence Life Bill

- Pro Marcus: yields time to Faith
 - Every residence hall would have all of the materials needed to reverse an opioid overdose. Would sit on the wall similar to an AED or fire extinguisher. Worked closely with the group (Rescued) on campus that would basically take care of all of the implementation of the bill. They would also be responsible for passing out the cards, which would be included in their orientation packet when they get to campus. Funding wise, the bill is intentionally left vague to try and find the best way to pay for it. This can take off stress from RAs so they know students have a way to be safe



- **Pro Marcus:** we passed a resolution to this effect last year, but it didn't work out because they believed that it would be an added stressor to RAs. This bill has changed it so that the responsibility is no longer on the RAs. Nalox Boxes are easy to use, it's a nasal spray and there is a card in the box that explains it step by step. This is also intended to lessen
- POI Mason: Where would these be placed
 - Faith: tried to get information about the placement of AEDs in the dorm but they couldn't find one. Decided instead to place them in each dorm's common space
- **POI Charlotte**: do you have an initial budget planned?
 - **Marcus:** meant to express student desire for a policy, this is laying out a groundwork, we're still in the process of figuring out the funding. This is a single up-front cost and anyone with connections to the state is able to maintain these boxes at very little cost. Still working on funding but will still be working on it while collecting signatures
- POI Katie: does narcan expire?
- **Faith**: shelf life is 18 months. The QR code will alert them when a box is empty, and they will change the narcan when it expires
- **POI Marlena**: even using expired narcan is better than not using narcan, still can be effective
 - Kieran motions for unanimous consent

SHRM - \$2,904.80 - Virginia State SHRM conference

- Professional development organization helping people interested in HR
- *\$10 dues per semester 25-30 members; bi-weekly meetings, professional development events, state and shenandoah valley meetings*
- Planning to take 11 members to Richmond for the HR competition and Student Day
 - 4 person team competing against about 5 other schools
 - Student day: seminars and networking events
- Fundraising:
 - Dues (\$220 [fall] & \$150 [spring]) = \$370
 - Dues cover meeting fees
 - Looking into more transportation options
 - Expenses: conference fees: \$2,750; Transportation: \$154.80

Madison Saxophone Society - \$2,920 - Carrie Koffman Recital and Masterclass

- \$10 dues; 12 members; hosts guest artists, fundraising, smaller scale events with fundraising
 - Carrie Koffman from Hartford University as well as a viola professor
 - Solo performance masterclass, small ensemble masterclass and a communications class
 - *Recital will be given with works that she commissioned (female who is making a name for herself, music is unique and different) open to the public*
- Fundraising:
 - Rubber duck sale, ornament sale, plastic barbie sale, barbie stickers \$1,526
 - Young organization doing their first bit of fundraising
- Expenses:
 - Guest artist fee, food costs, hotel costs, accompanist \$2,920

Questions:

- Marcus: Did you guys have her here for a masterclass last year
 - Personal issues came up and she couldn't make it
- AI: where will the performance be held, there is typically CVPA/School of Music funding involved in this
 - Anthony-Seeger, studios only get money to bring in artists 3-5 years (you only see one your whole time on campus) the organization is trying to bring in an artist every semester
 - Marcus: is there any cost associated with her public performance
 - o *no*
- *Mercy: how are you letting people know about these open events*
 - Advertise around campus to let people know what is going on

Debate:

- *Pro Zach: this is a good request to make sure JMU stays a very prestigious location with an outside artist that wouldn't normally be able to come*
- Pro AJ: CVPA students are expecting artists to come in and teach them, unfortunately, the Forbes center is more focused on bringing in artists for the community rather than students, this is an opportunity to change this
- *Pro Ella: having various types of masterclasses is so important for students, this is a very difficult career field to get a job in after college and this will give them people to see and connections in the field*
- Marlena yields time to Faith:
 - *Pro: anyone in music or anyone in the community (people who can't continue their instrument maybe) can benefit from this. This being an event of such high quality is a great opportunity for the whole campus*

Kesem at JMU: \$3,000 - Camp Kesem

- Work to ensure that every child affected by a parents cancer is never alone
- No dues; 30 members; camp, virtual cabin chats, friends and family days (501c3 organization)
- *30 volunteers and 50 children: week of fun activities and empowerment ceremonies for children who are impacted by cancer*
- Fundraising:
 - Individual fundraiser, proceeds night, philo week, make the magic \$19,000 (need \$40,000)
- Expenses:
 - *Camp costs, supples, staff, support etc \$40,980*
 - If they don't reach the fundraising goal they won't be able to allow

Bee Friendly Beekeeping Club - \$2420 - Hive visits and hive maintenance

- *\$10 dues; 77 members, hive visits, honey extractions, arboretum harvest fest, social events etc.*
- Event: more supplies that help students to be more efficient and less reliant
 - *Have to pay for a professional beekeep right now, and there is a limited amount of students able to participate*
 - Having their own supplies would allow them to be self sufficient
- Fundraising:
 - Dues & honey sales; \$1,700 all of the fundraising goes to the professional beekeepers
 - They have bees but no supplies (they are super new)
