Advising Notes for International Affairs

- 1. There are four concentrations under the International Affairs major: Comparative Study, Foreign Policy and Global Governance, Global Human Development, and International Conflict and Security.
- 2. International Affairs is a B.A. degree. The B.A. degree requirements are a philosophy class (PHI 100, not PHI 220) and intermediate proficiency in a foreign language. The major also requires two 300-level foreign language courses. Students who are proficient or fluent in another language may elect to wait and take JMU's foreign language placement exam. It is possible to test into the 300-level of a language. You may also choose to take foreign language courses at BRCC.
- 3. Electives that will count for the major: GEO 210 (all concentrations), CST 229 (all concentrations), HIS 102 (Foreign Policy and Global Governance and International Conflict and Security concentrations).
- 4. View options for <u>history electives</u>, <u>natural science electives</u>, <u>art/literature electives</u> (choose one course from art or literature; PHI 100 satisfies the humanities requirement), <u>math electives</u>, and <u>transfer core electives</u>.
