## Advising Notes for Art

- Students interested in these majors must pass a portfolio review in order to be accepted to the School of Art, Design and Art History. Information on the portfolio review process may be found on the [Art web site](#).
- Architectural, Graphic and Industrial Design require a second-tier portfolio review for admission to the upper-division major courses.
- Art 122, Drawing II, is **not** required for the B.A. or B.S. in Studio Art, or the B.S. in Industrial Design. Students who elect not to take ART 122 must choose an alternate approved elective.
- ART 153 (Ceramics I) will transfer as the introductory ceramics class at JMU.
- ART 241 (Painting I) will transfer as the introductory painting class at JMU.

## Information for Students Interested in Teaching Art (Pre-K-12)

- Students desiring PK-12 teaching licensure in art must complete 23 credits of additional course work in art education, education and psychology, and 16 credits of student teaching. Art education does **not** require a 5<sup>th</sup> year Master of Arts in Teaching degree.
- If you are planning on majoring in art in order to teach, one of your social science electives should be PSY 230. In addition, EDU 200 is required for admission to teacher education. Contact Ms. Annette Williams (information below) about signing up for that class.

## Admission to the College of Education

Once admitted and enrolled in courses at JMU, all students must apply to teacher education and be accepted before they can take the required education courses. Students who meet the criteria for the Guaranteed Admission Agreement (GAA) with JMU ([Guaranteed Admission Agreements](#)), have completed the coursework outlined in the advising guide for the appropriate teacher licensure area, and who have met the Teacher Education Admission Requirements outlined below will receive conditional admission into JMU Teacher Education during their first semester at JMU. Conditional admission to teacher education programs requires the completion of an English class (must transfer to JMU as WRTC 103), PSY 230 and EDU 200 with a grade of C or better, and satisfaction of the teacher education admission assessment requirements. See [Admission to Teacher Education](#) for more information. **Students cannot have any record of felony convictions or misdemeanors involving children or drugs.**

Other admission requirements include a cumulative JMU GPA of at least 2.5, satisfactory completion of training modules in universal precautions and child abuse prevention, and submission of two reference forms. These requirements should be completed by the end of a transfer student's first semester at JMU.
