#### **FUN**


School's out! Get outside & enjoy yourself before the next big steps!

# SPRING



#### **IDENTIFY**

your stronger areas of study, and consider taking the SAT subject test in those subjects. It's not vital, but it can set you apart from other college applicants.

external scholarship opportunities offered in your community. Check the VS website for help!

#### SAVE

for college expenses if possible: summer earnings & with your parents

with your community to find summer volunteer opportunities and/or a summer job. Consider whether you could start saving some money for college expenses.
