NEED TO KNOWS

- You can check your registration status online at elections.virginia.gov
- Virginia has an open primary system wherein any person, regardless of party affiliation, can vote
- You must request your absentee ballot by Feb. 25
- If you have a Virginia driver's license or ID you can request your ballot online, or it can be done by mail, fax, and email
- If you are going to be 18 by the time of the 2020 General Election, you may vote in the March primary at age 17
- To vote in-person, you will need a valid photo ID. See jmu.edu/vote for a list of options (your JAC Card is a valid form).
- Your polling location depends on your address. When checking your registration, make sure to check your polling location. *Only those with a 800 S. Main St. address vote at the old Convocation Center.*
- This Virginia primary determines how the Commonwealth's delegates will be allocated at the Democratic National Convention in July. Here, the candidate who receives the most delegates from among the states will be the party's nominee for the General Election November 3.
