



Photoshop Fix

Photoshop Fix allows users to retouch photos and to remove unwanted objects.

To open a photo:

Tap the + icon at the left side of the screen. You can either take a picture using the camera, or select an existing image from the Camera Roll or another Adobe app.

To adjust exposure, contrast, saturation and more:

1. Open or add a picture in Photoshop Fix.
2. Tap **Adjust**. The Adjust toolbar is displayed.
3. Tap **Auto Fix** to apply the best adjustments.
4. Adjust **Exposure**, **Contrast**, **Clarity**, or **Saturation** by tapping and swiping sideways to adjust the degree.
5. Accept the changes by clicking the checkmark or reject them by clicking the X.

To flip a photo vertically or horizontally:

1. Tap **Crop**.
2. Select a Flip H, Flip V, or Rotate 90%.
3. Tap the checkmark to accept.

To remove an unwanted object from a photo:

1. Select a picture or layer.
2. Tap **Healing**.
3. Select Spot Heal.
4. Adjust the size and hardness of the eraser by clicking on the button along the left side of the screen and dragging up or down to adjust.
5. Drag your finger or stylus over the item you want to remove. It may take several passes to remove the object completely.
6. Tap the checkmark to Accept.

To replace object or area with another color sample from a photo:

1. Select a picture or layer.
2. Tap **Healing**.
3. Select **Clone Stamp**.
4. Adjust the size and hardness of the stamp by clicking on the buttons along the left side of the screen and dragging up or down to adjust.
5. Tap your finger or stylus on the photo to select the color you want to replicate.
6. Tap or drag your finger where you want the selected color to duplicate.
7. Tap the checkmark to accept.
