



Photoshop Mix

Photoshop Mix allows users to cut out and place an object from one photo into another photo.

To open a photo:

Tap the + icon at the left side of the screen. You can either take a picture using the camera, or select an existing image from the Camera Roll or other Adobe app.

To adjust color, contrast, sharpness and more:

1. Open or add a picture in Photoshop Mix by tapping the plus sign.
2. Tap **Adjust**. The Adjust toolbar displays.
3. Tap **Auto Fix** to apply the best adjustments.
4. You can also select an adjustment mode such as **Exposure**, **Contrast**, **Clarity** or **Saturation**. Swipe sideways to adjust the degree.
5. Accept the changes by clicking on the checkmark, or reject changes by clicking the X.

To crop a photo:

1. Open a picture or composition.
2. Tap **Crop**.
3. Select a crop type, and then drag the crop handles to enclose the space you want to select.
4. Tap the checkmark to accept.

To cut out part of a photo or make a background transparent:

1. Select a picture or layer.
2. Tap **Cut Out**.
3. Select a tool to select to isolate or cut out an object.
 - Smart works great for photos with a lot of contrast between the item you want to cut out and the background or rest of the photo.
 - Lasso works best for photos without sharp contrast.
 - Add or Subtract feature in the left tool bar allows you to retouch your selection.
 - Refine will allow you to select Invert to select the opposite of what has been cutout or to soften the cut-out edges.
4. Use your finger or stylus to outline and fill the object you want to select. Anything not selected (such as the background) will be transparent.
5. Tap the checkmark to accept the cut out the object.

To Save your work:

Select the Share icon in the top right of the screen to send the object to your camera roll or to another Adobe app.
